Patient Participation Group Update

PPG Web Site Development

We have continued to develop and add to our web site to help point towards Self Help support services available to all patients. The surgery has been very supportive and encouraging about our efforts and has now directed patients to our site from their own web pages. If you haven't visited the site and you are in need of support or think you may need guidance on a variety of health issues, please take a look, as the services offered are widespread and comprehensive. If you think we have missed something, please bring it to our attention via the email address above and we will be pleased to include it.

Health Focus

High Blood Pressure is a leading cause of premature death. It puts strain on the heart and blood vessels which, in the long term, can lead to life-threatening conditions. The NHS wants more people over 40 to get a blood pressure check, saying there are millions who do not realise they have dangerously high levels. Often, there are no warning symptoms, and it is thought about a third of cases are undiagnosed, that is 4.2 million people in England alone. Take action now and check your blood pressure for free at surgeries or a pharmacy. There is an area to take your own readings in every surgery waiting room and you can submit the readings through DR iQ or hand them on a record slip to the receptionist for a Practitioner to review and add to your medical record. If the Practitioner has concerns you will be contacted to make an appointment. High Blood Pressure is easily treated in most cases.

Calling All Carers

Many Carers will be supporting a loved one and will not think of themselves as being a carer. I in 8 adults provide unpaid care for family and friends, whether round-the-clock or for a few hours a week. Caring is important but it can be tough. As a patient group we recognise the vital role that carers have and want to ensure they receive the right level of support they need to continue to care. We have produced a comprehensive summary of support available and have highlighted our Top Tips, amongst which are how to get a Needs Assessment for the carer and the cared for person and who the carer should register with for extra support when they need it. Can I take my child on holiday if the other parent objects?

This is a question we are often asked when holiday plans are being made for the summer. The issue for taking a child abroad for a holiday can often be a cause of conflict between separated parents.

If the "Lives With" Order is in your favour then you can take your child abroad for up to 28 days as long as there are no other court orders prohibiting this or setting out a different amount of time you can take them out of the country for.

What if the holiday has been booked and paid for?

For parents who have previously been able to agree on matters among themselves without requiring legal intervention, the other parent would still have a right of veto over a holiday abroad. This is even if the holiday has been booked and paid for.

In practice, the Court will consider what is in the best interest of the child if parents cannot agree and can make an order about whether they can or cannot go on a particular holiday. If

the holiday is soon you would have to seek an urgent hearing and this is not always simple.

If the holiday was originally agreed, prior to booking, and the other side subsequently withdraw their consent, to the child/ren going on the trip, without a legitimate reason, then on applying to the court you could also seek your costs back from the other side if the court allows the children to go on the holiday.

The Court will take into consideration issues such as the wishes and feelings of the child concerned and their educational and emotional needs.

Under normal circumstances, the Court will take a view that a holiday for a child is a good thing to be enjoyed.





COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP: I attended a meeting of the PPG with the management team of the four surgeries, Camrose, Gillies, Hackwood and Beggarwood, at which we discussed the purchase of Operose UK by HCRG Care Group (formerly known as Virgin Care). The key message was that Operose UK continues to operate - it just has a new owner and HCRG is based in the UK rather than the United States. The PPG is planning a meeting with representatives of HCRG to discuss their intentions and bring to their attention any local pressures of which HCRG should be aware.

RAISED DRAIN ON A30: I reported a problem with a raised drain on the A30 approaching the Hounsome Fields roundabout, coming from the M3. Apparently this caused a couple of punctures (at least). The Hampshire County Council highways team has made it safe, but motorists would be advised to keep a lookout for it. I am told that this is not a 'Hampshire' fitment, nor a Scottish and Southern Energy one (even though that is what it says on the cover itself). The Council is attempting to confirm whose responsibility it is.

HOUNSOME FIELDS MEETING: I attended a meeting in the Beggarwood Community Centre to discuss issues affecting the new Hounsome Fields development. One of them is the need for a crossing of the A30. The convenience store is built, and people will be looking to cross the road from the Golf Course development to get to it. Added to that, the new primary school on Hounsome Fields is due to open in September next year, and parents will be anxious to have a safe crossing of this very busy road available to use.

MCDONALDS: I have written to the Borough Council objecting to the application to run a McDonalds restaurant from the Hatch Warren Retail Park. My fears are that the opening hours are not defined and could compromise the security Improvement measure of locking the gates at 10.30pm to protect the car park from car meets The site is close to residential housing, residents fear noise and antisocial behaviour intrusion, traffic management is unaddressed and the activities could impact adversely on Beggarwood Park.

HOW THE TWO-STAGE SYSTEM WORKS: Some people have been confused by the 'two stage' process that planning applications like this go through. The first stage is to address the principle of serving food from the shop unit. That is difficult to oppose, as it could include (say) a shop with a cafe, a 'conventional' restaurant, a bakery or a tea shop, for example. The second stage is for a specific application to be submitted, and that is where it becomes apparent that the application is on behalf of McDonalds.

SCHOOL CROSSING PATROLS: At a meeting with the Leader of Hampshire County Council, one of the issues I raised was that of School Crossing Patrols. I have also discussed this with the Executive Member responsible. I have suggested that where there are patrols in place, they should be retained (many are vacant). I have also suggested setting up a capital fund to pay for trafficlight controlled crossings where they are needed. I am anxious that children and parents, having been encourage to park in the

community centre across Woodbury Road, should continue to benefit from a School Crossing Patrol.

SCHOOLS MEETING: I am planning to attend a meeting at HCC to review the performances of the schools in the Borough. This is an extremely useful briefing that identifies the opportunities and risks faced by each of them.

GOLF COURSE COMMUNITY FACILITIES: The planning application for the Community Hub in the Bloor Homes development has been submitted. It proposes a community hall, a nursery, a convenience store and two smaller shops of 50 sq metres each. I am not sure what the demand is for small stores at the moment, and am wondering whether, if they are not taken up, they could be merged and used for (say) a dental surgery. I shall take advice.

MEET THE POLICE TEAM: our local Safer Neighbourhood Team (PC 23164 Geldard & PCSO Page) have been holding 'meet the team' drop-in meetings in the area to give us the opportunity to raise any issues that may be of concern. For more information please contact christian.geldard@hampshire.police.uk

BASINGSTOKE'S HUB OF CREATIVITY AND INNOVATION

In the heart of Basingstoke, there's a special place where the community comes together to create, learn, and collaborate. This unique space is known as the Basingstoke Makerspace, and it's a true gem that deserves to be highlighted.

The Makerspace first came into being in 2016 as an informal group of makers and hobbyists meeting in various community venues around Basingstoke. But in 2017, the group took a big step forward when they were able to secure a home in Maritime House, a building at 65 New Road that was for many years the home of the Royal Naval Association. This allowed the Makerspace to truly flourish, expanding its offerings and drawing in an ever-growing community of members.

Today, the Basingstoke Makerspace is a bustling hive of activity, equipped with an impressive array of tools and equipment that members can access 24/7. From 3D printers and laser cutters to metalworking tools, woodworking equipment, and beyond, the space provides makers of all kinds the resources they need to bring their creative visions to life.

Basingstoke Makerspace is not just a workshop – it's a hub of learning and skill-sharing. Every Tuesday evening, the space opens its doors to the public for 'Open Evenings' from 7pm to 9pm, where anyone can come in, explore the facilities, and get advice and assistance from resident experts. These sessions have become a beloved tradition, sparking all sorts of new ideas and connections.

Unfortunately, the future of the Basingstoke Makerspace is now in

jeopardy. The owners of Maritime House have decided to sell the building, and if the Makerspace can't raise the funds to purchase it, they may be forced to vacate their beloved home. That's why the organisation has launched a bold initiative, an application for government support through the Community Ownership Fund. If granted, this must be matched by a community bond issue that will allow members of the public to invest in the Makerspace's future and earn interest while doing so.

"This is a critical moment for us," Hawtin acknowledges. "But we're confident that the local community will rally behind us. The Basingstoke Makerspace is a truly unique and valuable asset, and we're determined to ensure that it continues to serve makers, learners, and innovators for years to come."

BASINGSTOKE MALE VOICE CHOIR – 60 YEARS OLD

2024 sees the 60th anniversary of Basingstoke Male Voice Choir. The choir was the 'brainchild' of Idris 'Taffy' Roberts – a local police traffic cop who managed to recruit a hardcore of singers by fair means and foul! The first rehearsal took place in April 1964 in Coombehurst school which then existed in Basingstoke.

Over the years choir managed to attract more members and at its peak in the mid 80s the choir numbered almost 100 choristers. During the next 60 years the choir performed at various Welsh eisteddfodau, gave numerous concerts, appeared on TV with Harry Secombe as well as touring Canada, USA and the Netherlands. During that period the choir also raised £000s for local good causes including St Michael's Hospice, the Camrose centre, the Samaritans and Parkinson's society to name but a few.

Sadly our numbers have declined over the years, but the choir is still alive and well and rehearses every Tuesday evening at 7:30PM at the Moose Centre. You're most welcome to come along and listen and, maybe, join us for the next 60 years!

To celebrate our anniversary we shall be staging a celebratory concert at Church Cottage (adjacent to St Michael's Church) in Basingstoke on June 29th 7.30pm. We'd

OLD DOWN & BEGGARWOOD WILDLIFE GROUP

wildlife Group We had our AGM on 11 April. The Group has decided to split ODBWG into two groups: Old Down - and separately - Beggarwood. The reason for this is that the two sites are so very different and serve different communities. The names, logo and contact details are in the process of being decided.

The Group has now run two Sunday workparties on Old Down (third on 28th April). 24th March was well attended and hedge trimming and dogwood removal were the main tasks carried out. Sunday work parties will recommence in the Autumn. If you are interested please email the Group and we will add you to our mailing list. We are still running our weekly Thursday morning work parties throughout the year.

It is quite common to hear and see gulls flying over Old Down. The different gull species are not the easiest to identify. All are white and black/grey. The gull species most likely to be seen over Old

Down are Herring, Lesser Black-Backed and Black-Headed. They are mostly coastal but come inland in the winter. The Herring Gull is large and noisy with light grey back, black wing tips, curved yellow bill with red spot and pink legs. The Lesser Black Backed Gull is slightly smaller with slate grey upper parts and yellow/orange legs. The Black Headed Gull is noticably smaller with pale upper parts and dark reddish legs and bill. In summer plumage the head is dark brown (not black) but this colouring fades in winter and the head is mostly white with dark smudges above the eyes and a black tip appears on the bill. If the gulls stand in line, it is pretty easy to identify them — but not easy when they are flying overhead!





MAY DAY AND THE MAY TREE

Celebrations for the coming of early summer date back at least to Roman times with the festival of Flora from late April to early May. In Hampshire, May day festivities became popular during the middle ages, although their pagan roots were somewhat frowned on by the church.

Local people may have enjoyed May Day with partying and dancing; chimney sweeps and milkmaids were especially favoured as participants. There might be a maypole to dance around, and a May Queen chosen. Branches of May blossom would be cut and carried as garlands and made into the May Queen's crown, although it was considered unlucky to bring Hawthorn into the home.

with many other such celebrations, including Christmas, Oliver Cromwell's protectorate did not approve of the merry

making and May Day was banned. But the festival returned with the coronation of Charles II.

The May tree used for these celebrations, the Hawthorn, flowers between April and June and is shrouded in myth and folklore. It is said that it should never be cut down as it is sacred to the Fae Folk, and to destroy a hawthorn would bring bad luck. This connection with the other world is so strong in folklore that there are many tales of people falling asleep under a May Tree and waking up to find they have entered the land of Faery.

As well as being beautiful and steeped in tradition, the Hawthorn is a vital native hedgerow tree and provides food for hundreds of species including a wide variety of moths, bees and other pollinators, many different types of birds and small mammals.

- · Can sit still for a short period
- Can separate from parents/carers

- Communication and language skills needed to communicate needs and listen to others
- Can actively learn and creatively and critically think

Some of these characteristics may of course be difficult for all children to achieve and this shouldn't leave parents or practitioners concerned that a child isn't school ready.

The six-minute feature was broadcast on II March, and it's already evident that the Mill's profile has been raised as a result. The full clip can be found on ITVX. We hope that seeing the working inside the Mill will encourage more café users to cross the threshold into the Mill building and see our fascinating historic machinery and many information panels.

National Mills Weekend 2024, II-I2 May 10.30-5pm

In celebration of the engineers and millwrights who built and now restore and maintain Whitchurch Silk Mill, Nigel Spender of G & H Spender Engineering, a historic Basingstoke company specialising in industrial heritage conservation and restoration, will be here to talk to visitors about the many crafts used during his company's recent conservation of the Mill's Grade Two listed Georgian waterwheel, and the historic craft of millwrighting. Included with admission fee or annual pass.

10,000 Years of Textiles, 15 May, 7-8.30pm

In this illustrated talk, Angela Pawlyn, a member of the Oxford and Kennet Valley Guilds of Weavers Spinners and Dyers, will show examples of preserved textiles. 

Changes...

How do you feel about change? Do you embrace it and feel invigorated by it? Or are you resistant and want our fast-paced changing world to slow down a bit? While composing this article, I have had David Bowie's song "Changes" going through my head! I was reflecting that I like change and exploring different ideas and perspectives, but it can be a bit unsettling. And it keeps you on your toes! This is the time of year when we see so many changes with new growth in our gardens and in the countryside. I love seeing our garden change and come back to life as nature embraces the warmer temperatures, and we start having longer days.

So much of life is about continual change. Nothing stays the same and of course, it shouldn't. The Greek Philosopher, Heraclitus, who lived about 500 years before Christ said, "There is nothing permanent except change".



CHECKING IF **SOMETHING** MIGHT BE A SCAM

- You've been asked to pay in an unusual way for example, by iTunes, vouchers or through a transfer service like MoneyGram or Western Union,

- You haven't had written confirmation of what's been agreed.

PROBUS HEARS ABOUT WW2 S.O.E. TRAINING AT BEAULIEU

Visitors to the national Car Museum at Beaulieu, in the New Forest, may have spotted a building close to Palace House which is a museum about the training that took place in WW2 for the S.O.E. Inside is an exhibition about the Secret Army.



The Special Operations Executive was the subject of the latest talk at the Probus Club of Basingstoke by speaker Nick Saunders who is a part time archivist at the Royal Hampshire Regiment Museum in Winchester.

The S.O.E. was set up in 1940 on instructions of Prime Minister Winston Churchill, to "Set Europe ablaze" by conducting espionage, sabotage and reconnaissance in German occupied Europe and to aid local resistance movements.

It was not an easy formation as sections of the Secret Intelligence Service (MI6) refused to share facilities in signals training and other sections of the Military top brass also denied the use of their training places. While the S.O.E. had its headquarters in Baker Street, London, opposite the fictional address of Sherlock Holmes, all training took place around the country.

The organisation generated different unofficial names, *The Baker Street Irregulars, Churchill's Secret Army, Ministry of Ungentlemanly Warfare* with the most apt, *Stately 'omes of England*, as many country houses and private estates were requisitioned. Several such large properties existed around the Beaulieu estate and served as training bases specialising in the dark arts of guerrilla activities.





For security reasons nationalities were kept apart during their time in the S.O.E. to ensure that if captured they would not be able to disclose any knowledge of comparative secret operations in other countries. So effective was this compartmentalising of nationalities that in 1942 five governments in exile, who suggested setting up some form of training for agents to be dropped into occupied countries, were surprised to learn that the S.O.E. had been in operation for two years.





Silent killing, parachute skills, radios, morse code and weapons training were the main courses. Burglary skills were taught as agents would need to access occupied buildings with tests being given of breaking into Palace House and stealing a bank cheque but without leaving any signs of entry.

It was imperative that their agents had a good knowledge of a particular country and that their language skills were sufficient to pass as a native. Although 13,000 agents underwent training, which included 3,000 at the Beaulieu Finishing School, there were many women who undertook the same training and had volunteered to assume roles in German occupied countries.

The Germans knew about what was happening at Beaulieu and named it *The Gangster School*. Among the 175 staff at Beaulieu were Guy Burgess and Kim Philby, who later, unearthed as Soviet spies, absconded to Russia. They taught mind games on how to undermine German morale.

The agents dropped into occupied countries should not be compared to the fictional BBC TV series 'Allo 'Allo! which was a wartime sitcom about the French Resistance with the farcical events set around a café, as many agents were captured, tortured and executed.

This was different! The brave new world of Festival Place Kitchen with their move from outside to inside. Apart from a postman, our dear reader is probably like me in having little clue to the "street"

names in Festival Place, so my simplest description is that the Festival Street Kitchen is just along from Iceland having taken over the corner premises previously occupied by hairdressers, Toni & Guy.

They opened here immediately before this Easter. They had gutted the place and completely redecorated, mainly in black with bright graffiti type lettering over the bar counter, and interesting overhead lighting using different coloured wooden crates to act as light shades. With everything involved in making this substantial move their web site has yet to be updated.

With pleasant, helpful staff, it had a young person's feel about the place with seating on picnic benches or on highchairs surrounding tall barrels although there were a few booths for a little privacy.

The menu, shown on a series of blackboards, was mainly Tex-Mex with a smattering of Italian and Jamaican offerings. Madam had a double beef burger with some hand cut freshly cooked chips. Delicious, she declared, possibly because the burgers were proudly advertised as being supplied by Newlyns Farm Shop.

I had a pulled pork burrito which came with spicy rice and a few other things just to add flavour. In her infinite wisdom Madam ordered the large one for me and it proved difficult to finish. Again, very flavoursome. Everything is delivered to



table in take away type containers and the use of wooden cutlery.

A bottle of fruit juicy water for Madam and a can of diet Coke for me was sufficient for our lunch with the bill coming to

PINEAPPLE FRUIT CAKE

This recipe is from my grandmother's note book and all the ingredients are in imperial weights. It is easy, delicious and very

5oz margarine or butter

4.5oz soft brown sugar

7oz self raising flour

2 large eggs

2oz glacé cherries, chopped

12oz mixed dried fruit

8oz tin pineapple, crushed and drained

Line a cake tin with baking paper and set oven at 325 degrees.

Cream the fat and sugar together till soft and fluffy. Beat in eggs. Sieve flour and fold into mixture. Add chopped glacé cherries, dried fruit and crushed pineapple. If the mixture is a little dry, add a little drained pineapple juice or milk.

Put mixture into cake tin and bake for I-I.5 hours. Test cake with a skewer to check when done.


