Patient Participation Group Update

PPG Web Site Development

This now seems to be a "go to" location for information about local health related services as recently we have seen more than 1000 visits per week! The surgery has welcomed the content in its endeavour to help with the NHS push for patients to think more about "Self Help" enterprises as well as giving helpful news around the PPG and matters concerning the four surgery locations. If you haven't visited yet, why not give it a look?

Health Focus

There is an extensive network of local and national resources and support groups available to you. Working with the practice the PPG has created and launched the Self Help pages, which are available to you on the PPG website and the Practice will be integrating this resource into their working practices. It will take some time to create a bank of texts for staff to select to guide you to this information and in the meantime you can still carry out your own research directly on the pages.

This month the PPG are providing information on two subjects, Lung Health and Cancer Awareness. Further information is on our Self Help Pages at the address above, simply click Cancer Support or Lung Health.

Some Highlights from the pages:

- This month is Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month: Symptoms to look out for are a bloated tummy, tummy pain, needing to wee more and always feeling full. -The charity 'Target Ovarian Cancer' has more information and an advice line, or you could ring NHS 111 if you have concerns.
- The local 'Breath Easy' support group meets monthly and is for people with Asthma and Lung Conditions.
- 13th March is National No Smoking Day. 'Smoke Free Hampshire' offers a free service to help you quit smoking. Why not take control of your lung health and join many others who will quit this month?

Patient Feedback

Last month there was a glitch at the practice around some appointments being booked at the wrong surgery. This was due to human error. Members of staff have undertaken re-training and this should not re-occur.

The PPG has also raised accessibility issues at the Hackwood surgery and the practice is working to have the landlord address these and other issues.

It was noted that the surgery was closed for a half day on Wednesday 28th February as were all surgeries across North Hampshire for a training session dictated by the local NHS ICB. The somewhat obscure closure poster had been provided by the ICB and the Practice Manager took on board the need for the surgery to improve on its visibility for future occasions.

Dr.iQ Training

The PPG and the surgery ran a further training session at the end of February for a group of patients invited by the surgery. The session was regarded as helpful and they were able to solve the problems of all patients who attended. These sessions will be repeated and managed by CGHB and the PPG.

CGHB Surgery Update

Recruitment

In 2024 there were 20.5 newly salaried GP sessions, replacing some locums There has been no staff losses in 2024 and a new nurse practitioner has been recruited. A receptionist has moved to the medical reports team to help with the backlog in this area and a replacement recruited, with a further replacement ready in two weeks, together with a new practice nurse. The recruitment situation is currently good with only two receptionist vacancies outstanding within the support team.

Measles

Measles is an infection that spreads very easily and can cause serious problems in some people. Cases of measles are increasing.

The main symptoms of measles are:

a high temperature (fever) and a rash alongside a cough or red, sore, watery eyes; or a runny or blocked nose.

If you think you or your child may have measles, do not attend the surgery, contact your GP practice either via the telephone or DriQ.

Other Items

The surgery has a system where texts are sent out 7 days and I day before an appointment as a reminder but asks patients to ensure they have noted the appointment detail when it is made.

The practice clarified that where appointments are not available for on-going pre-planned treatment such as injections, the patient should ask receptionists to escalate their appointment request to the Practice Manager who will be able to arrange this. It was also noted that Blood tests can still be booked at either

It was also noted that Blood tests can still be booked at either the surgery or on-line at the Hospital whichever is more convenient for the patient.

In December there were 21,000 telephone calls received by the practice. Seasonal illnesses caused a rise in requests for consultations, which slowed appointment availability. There is always a need to Triage to ensure that the most urgent cases are seen first.

Comments, Feedback & Complaints

The surgery welcomes feedback from patients and strives to learn from us in helping them deliver a first class service. Please also note that if you do have reason to complain about a service or anything related to the surgery that this matter is kept confidential, will be logged and tracked on a separate system and no record of this is entered on your medical records.

COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

MCDONALDS: I have written to the Borough Council objecting to the application to open a McDonalds restaurant on the Hatch Warren Retail Park. I don't object to fast food outlets in principle, but this specific proposal has difficulties attaching. I offered the following reasons:

- I. The opening hours of the store are not defined. I arranged a few months ago for the gates to the Hatch Warren Retail Park to be locked at 10.30pm to protect the car park from mis-use by car meets, that were occurring there regularly and causing distress to residents across the estate. The nature of the takeaway business would compromise this essential security unless opening hours are severely restricted.
- 2. The site is too close to housing. I fear odour, noise and light pollution caused by the nature of the business and potential extended opening hours.
- 3. Local residents fear noise and ASB intrusion. The application is silent about any steps that might be taken to mitigate these fears.
- 4. No details are given about traffic management. The site has the potential of generating traffic through the Hatch Warren estate rather than on the A30.
- 5. I fear that the business could impact adversely on the Beggarwood Park area, in terms of ASB and litter.

LOCAL PLAN: I have also written to the Borough Council offering comments on the draft local plan. This is a very important document that will shape the development of the Borough for 10-15 years. In my opinion, the rate of growth being proposed (850 homes per year, on average) is too high and needs to slow down. 18,000 new homes are planned for this side of the town, which I fear will lead to decades of road works and disruption, not to mention the increased traffic, with which the existing road system will have to cope.

SPEEDWATCH: I have so far been contacted by a couple of residents willing to take part in a 'Community Speed Watch' initiative and I am grateful to them. I need more names to make up a large enough team. I am doing this is conjunction with our designated Police Officer, PC Christian Geldard, who has posted that speeding is one of the hot topics of concern in our area. This has been amplified by car meets that have been using our local roads irresponsibly. If you would be interested in volunteering for this, please contact me on sreid I 7786@aol.com

CAR MEETS: as if on cue, it looks as if we are suffering car meets again. The Police are asking for our help regarding information and witnesses. They were called at 7.42pm on Sunday 18th February to a meet at the ASDA car park. About 60 cars had gathered and some were being used in an antisocial manner. The cars dispersed after officers attended, but it looks as if they simply moved to the Leisure Park and Chineham, where there were reports of dangerous driving. The Police are looking to take action against two drivers, but would appreciate any help people may have with dashcam footage or CCTV cameras.

SCHOOL CROSSING PATROL: St Mark's School is reporting that over 600 people signed its petition to save its School Crossing Patrols. It has now been submitted to Hampshire County Council. The school will be presenting to the Council in June when it takes the decisions on funding and I will be supporting them. The irony here is that the school encourages parents to park in the

Community Centre car park and walk the short distance, crossing Woodbury Road in the process. It would seem contradictory then to do away with the crossing patrol. I have made this point in my response to Hampshire's consultation on future service provision.

CAR THEFTS: I have seen a couple of posts on social media from households in the Hatch Warren and Beggarwood area who have had their cars stolen from their drives. In both cases the thieves were using devices on poles, which they held up against the windows, presumably to detect and relay keyless entry information from fobs inside the homes. The Police offer advice to protect your property against these crimes, and some measures - like 'faraday pouches' - are relatively inexpensive.

TRAINING CLOSURE AT LOCAL SURGERIES: I investigated the closures of the GP surgeries on the afternoon of 28th February, and found that they were organised by the Integrated Care Board, that they were for 'team building' training and they extended across the town. Given that this was also one of the days of junior doctor strikes at the hospital, I cannot help but feel that this was poorly planned and something that should be avoided in the future.

DIGESTATE SPREADING: The operators of the Anaerobic Digester were spreading Digestate, their waste product, (very nutritious, very smelly) in the Farleigh Wallop area in March. They published details of the measures they were taking to combat the odour pollution dangers in Beggarwood and Hatch Warren. Even so, there were some adverse comments on social media.

ST MARK'S SCHOOL has had a inspection by Hampshire County Council. The school reports that one comment was: "Pupils' learning behaviours are strong. There is a culture of respect and high regard for one another throughout the school. Children enjoy coming to school and are enthusiastic about their curriculum and can articulate how their learning builds over time." That is very positive.

'SCHOOL RUN' ISSUES: St Mark's reports several complaints regarding poor parking at pick up and drop off times. It is asking that drivers respect local residents and follow the usual parking rules, even if this means parking further away from school.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUB: Hatch Warren Community Centre has welcomed the relaunch of the After School Club. It can collect children from St Mark's School. The booking system is now open. With over 16 years of childcare experience, Louise, Gill and Narinder look forward to welcoming you back. Contact points are 07415 546491 and study@hampshirelearning.co.uk. Sessions cost £15.

HATCH WARREN RUNNERS celebrated their eleventh anniversary in March. They started with just ten members and now have over three hundred whose distinctive blue and yellow shirts are a regular sight in Basingstoke.



TRAFFIC ALERT FOR BASINGSTOKE!

CAGE wants all residents in the Basingstoke area to know that there is a third Planning Application (PA) (23/03120/FUL) in process for an 8-warehouse site on 100 acres of open farmland next to junction 7 of the M3. The site is known as Oakdown Farm. Should this PA get approval it will mean 2.5 vehicles, (including cars, HGVs, vans etc.) will enter the warehouse site every 1 minute. Given the traffic problems in the area from existing and future housing developments including Many Down South, the traffic on M3 as well as the road system in and around Basingstoke will increase considerably.

There are no plans to improve junction 7 nor will there be any new roads on the west of Basingstoke to improve traffic flows.

at Old Down Hall. Please do come along to show your support for Old Down and for Beggarwood. There will be a short wildlife presentation, an update on the group's work and refreshments — tea/coffee and homemade cake.

The group ran its first Sunday workparty on Old Down on 25 Febrauary. Sadly not many local people turned up but there were enough from other groups to get some tasks done — mainly removal of dogwood (it gets everywhere, especially where not wanted!) and removal of some old dead bramble. We worked for almost 3 hours (rain held off) with a short break for tea/coffee and cake. The next Sunday work parties will be on 24th March and 28th April. If you are interested please email the group and we will add you to our mailing list or you can just turn up on the day. We are still running our Thursday morning work parties.

Although bird numbers and species on Old Down are diminishing one can always rely on seeing a good number of members of the tit family — Blue Tit, Great Tit, Coal Tit and Long Tailed Tit. In the past there has been seen the odd Marsh Tit — but not in recent years. The Long Tailed Tit is a very sweet looking bird, small and rather fluffy looking, usually moving about in a small flock and having a high pitched call. They make a very intricate small dome-topped nest with side entrance made with lichen, moss and tiny feathers woven together with cobwebs...

Work Parties: For Old Down we meet outside Old Down Hall every Thursday 10-12noon (but not in the rain!) and for Beggarwood at the café on the first Tuesday of the month 9-12noon. Please do come and join us – we really do need new members and support. Check the website for further information.





BEGGARWOOD

A reader has suggested that we look at the history of Beggarwood. For centuries the main use of the land was farming, but here's some information from the BDBC management plan for Beggarwood Park:

Much of the site lies below a high ridge which is likely to have had an historic importance to the local area. There are a number of archaeological settlements on this ridge, as well as Bronze Age burial mounds, individual Bronze Age burials and a roman cremation cemetery (see figure 3). The survival of the Bronze Age burial mounds at Old Down until the last century implies that this was downland pasture through the prehistoric, Roman and medieval period.

It would also appear that the northern boundary (Lower Belt) is of great age and historic importance. It is probably medieval in origin, but may well represent some much earlier landscape division between the lower farmed landscape and a higher pasture landscape with woods on the highest clay capped ground.

Evidence of domestic and farm buildings and enclosures dating back to the Iron Age (750 BC to 43 AD) have been found at the west end of the Park. At the east end, are a Bronze Age (2000 BC to 750 BC) ring ditch - the remains of a burial mound, and further linear features thought to be enclosures.

Evidence of patchy settlement in the area has also been found in the form of graves close to Beggarwood Lane discovered when the estate was being constructed from 2001 onwards. (I included some details of this in a previous article a few months ago).

Coming forward in time, the Roman Road linking Silchester and Winchester became the main thoroughfare in the area, and the Basingstoke and Stockbridge Trust turnpiked it in the late 1700s. This required a tollgate for payments, and in 1801 the trust moved the tollgate to the junction between Beggarwood Lane and Kempshott Hill, with milestones erected.

Kempshott House, discussed in a previous Rabbiter, had extensive grounds and the boundary of the great estate reached down to the Beggarwood area. A document from the Institute of Historical Research states:

In the north of the parish there were two carriage drives approaching Kempshott House through the parkland from the Basingstoke to Winchester road. One skirted the edge of Peak Copse and the other joined Beggarwood Lane, passing through the Coachroad Belt woodland. In 2020 the lane was preserved as a cul-de-sac, Old Beggarwood Lane, with the earlier line of the road preserved as a footpath linking it to the A30.



Fully embracing our true selves

As the year continues on through April, we continue to celebrate the Easter season and Spring is well and truly upon us.

What are you finding particularly hard at the moment? Is the economic climate hitting you hard? Is loneliness a struggle? Has your mental or physical health taken more of a dip this winter? Do you have family struggles? Are you out of work?

Recently I've been reflecting on while taking photos of daffodils. Initially I was trying to ensure I framed just the flowers and then noticed that taking a photo with a backdrop of a block of flats highlighted the colours even more. While I may not usually have noticed the tower block or may have been annoyed at its presence, fully accepting it and embracing it, enhanced the beauty of the daffodils.

As a late diagnosed autistic individual, to find where I belong. Sometimes I've asked for adjustments, but I've come across barriers. Having come to terms with my differences and embraced them, as I did with the daffodils, I can now see how diversity can be an advantage. I recognise that God has always fully accepted me just as I am. I now advocate for the needs of others, for example, in the workplace, diversity isn't just a social responsibility; it is a strategic advantage that enhances creativity, decision-making, employee engagement, and overall organisational performance.

Are there things that could help with your struggles at the moment? While there may be things out of your control, for example we can't do anything about the economic climate, we can ask for support with budgeting or look for ways to cut bills. It may be a combination of accepting the things we're not in control of but making brave decisions about the things we can change.

When we're struggling, we may become very inward looking, the dark cloud may feel very difficult to shift as everything we do may shrouded by the stress. Making the effort to take a different perspective may be hard but it could make all the difference. Perhaps a change in direction is due? Maybe asking for help is something you don't usually do but now is the time?

The world is an incredibly diverse place. We may prefer to surround ourselves with people who agree with us or to stay in our comfort zone. However, true beauty is when we embrace difference, we listen to the stories of other people, and we wonder if change is possible. As a Christian, God teaches us to love our neighbour. While we're busy worrying about our own struggles, it may be hard to embrace this teaching as well. However, I believe working together as a community, we'll be more likely to relieve each other's stresses and strains.

The Bible teaches us, no matter what you're struggling with, God loves you, just the way you are. God made each one of us unique, beautifully diverse, with purpose and intension.



NEW OLYMPIC STANDARD PLAYING PITCH FOR DOWN GRANGE

Hockey and football players of all ages in the borough can now benefit from a new world-class playing surface at Down Grange Sports Complex in Kempshott, Basingstoke.

PROBUS HEAR ABOUT THE WIT AND SATIRE OF GILBERT & SULLIVAN

The speaker, Dr Stephen Goss, immersed the members of the Probus Club in his subject as he delved into the background of some of the famous and amusing operettas created by Gilbert and Sullivan in the nineteenth century.

Although one member, as a schoolboy, had taken part in a performance many members

had not seen such performances on stage. And yet, most of these works are well known and it came easy to hear renditions of several of the popular songs.

Arthur Sullivan

Seeing the words on a large screen brought home the skill of the librettist. The audiences of the day were drawn towards the clever writing rather than the accompanying music of the more famous composer, Arthur Sullivan, that made the credits change to Gilbert and Sullivan.

Arthur Seymour Sullivan had been brought up in a musical household where his father

was a band master and as a child Arthur was a chorister in the Chapel Royal. He attended the Royal Academy of Music and following three years at the Leipzig Conservatory, he initially struggled to make a living as a conductor, organist, teacher and choir master. He wrote serious music including for royal occasions and became well known as

England's most promising composer.

William Schwenck Gilbert had a variety of jobs most of which needed a good level of expertise in the English language. He had been a civil servant, a barrister, a comic journalist and became a captain in the militia. He drew on the experiences from these occupations writing four plays a year for ten years.

It was interesting to discover the witty commentary on contemporary society, with a look at the stories behind some

of most famous pieces of music. WS Gilbert developed the 'topsyturvy' words that become so familiar, and Arthur Sullivan was able to compose music that suited each situation.

They wrote fourteen comic operas between 1871 – 1896 with the


most popular being HMS Pinafore, The Pirates of Penzance and The Mikado. They were hugely successful with HMS Pinafore having an initial run of 571 performances and within a year was on the stage in USA and across the world.

The thinly veiled satire of some of the plots was uncovered to the enjoyment of the audience, along with the unmasking of characters which were deliberate parodies of specific Victorian politicians and notables. Gilbert's political satire often provoked fun at the wealthy and powerful whom Sullivan sought out for friendship and patronage.

Richard D'Oyly Carte brought Gilbert and Sullivan together and nurtured their collaboration. He built the Savoy Theatre in 1881 to present their joint works which became known as the Savoy Operas and was the first public building in the world to be lit by electricity. The D'Oyly Carte Opera Company was formed just to promote these operettas and performed over 35,000 Gilbert and Sullivan's creations, only closing in 1982.

Gilbert and Sullivan had the attention of Victorian society with the wit and satire appealing to popular audiences but was forecast to be transitory. Today, 140 years later they are still enjoyed throughout the English speaking world.

What an interesting place this is. It is well off the beaten track and don't let your satnay just use the postcode as mine sent me off the main A339 Newbury Road into Crabs Hill instead of immediately before into Ramsdell Road, where it is signposted. This place is much more Wolverton Common than Tadley.

Then through what appear to be gates to a private estate, with a long driveway that leads into the farmyard. The deli is on the left, next to a butcher's shop.

Outside seating leads into a bit of a Tardis, and the simple entrance with three tables already occupied takes visitors into the deli with an extensive range of English cheeses and blackboards highlighting the daily specials. There were more tables around a corner.

There were three of us on this visit and it was late lunchtime. and we hardly scratched the surface of what a selection of food was available. We settled for paninis- all different. Our friend had bacon, brie and cranberry, Madam had ham and cheese and I had a tuna and cheese melt. They came with a salad garnish and were excellent.

A tea, coffee and a diet Pepsi were our beverages, and the total bill was £29.

A board advertised BBQ lessons on several upcoming Sundays and some nice little gifts are there to tempt an impulse purchase. Apparently, cooked breakfasts here are a speciality. They close at 3.00 pm so this is not a place for a late afternoon tea.

Would we go again? Without a doubt.





SPICED PORK SAUTE

This recipe was given to me by a friend back in the mid 1970s. It very much a dish of that time. However I still cook it and everyone loves it.

500-600gm of pork fillet

I large onion

I green pepper

2 tablespoon oil

Can of sliced peaches

I level teaspoon French mustard

1/4 level teaspoon ground ginger

1/4 level teaspoon ground cinnamon

Salt and pepper

I tablespoon lemon juice

Trim pork into 3/4" cubes. Slice onion and cut pepper into cubes.

Heat oil in frying pan and add vegetables. Cook for 5 minutes till soft. Remove from pan and place on plate. Add meat to pan and cook gently for 10 minutes, turning occasionally.

Return vegetables to pan. Pour in juice from can of peaches.

Add mustard and spices. Simmer for 5 minutes. Stir in peaches and lemon juice. Heat through and add salt and pepper as necessary. Serve with boiled rice.


